She will entertain, inspire, inform, and delight in an exploration of how artists and writers have eaten, cooked, and depicted food in the visual arts and literature over time.



Artist Talk with Renée Stout Wednesday, November 11 at 10 a.m.



Washington DC artist Renée Stout is fascinated by imagined and historical icons of African American lore from the days of slavery to today. Her art explores the intersection of traditions, "Hoodoo" and modern culture. As she explains, " The common thread running through bodies of my work... is the continuing need for self-discovery and the need to understand and make sense of human motives and the way we relate and respond to each other."

Stout's striking color lithograph portrait of the legendary Marie Laveau is shown the KIA's installation of Common Ground (thru November 15). You will want to hear and meet this outstanding artist in preparation for seeing her solo exhibit at the KIA, Renée Stout: Tales of the Conjure Woman (opening in July 2016). Stout has exhibited in solo and group hows in numerous major museums and galleries, and is the recipient of many prestigious awards.

The Turner show is a limited opportunity to enjoy works of "fiery, impressionistic scenes that departed radically from the lush idyll on which his fame was based." You will also want to visit other AGO galleries, plus the Henry Moore Sculpture Center, an extraordinary and extensive collection of Henry Moore works. On Wednesday senior staff will welcome you to the ROM, one of North America's largest and most distinguished museums. We will tour with a ROM curator, and then you will have time to explore the ROM's many treasures on your own. Choose from among examples of outstanding Chinese temple art to rare antiquities from Mesopotamia and ancient Egypt, and dinosaurs too!

In the evening, enjoy a light reception with visiting Chef Ernesto laccarino. It's offered in conjunction with **Pompeii: In the Shadow of the Volcano**, an exhibition of over 200 artifacts from the office of Archaeological Heritage of Naples and Pompeii. The rare appearance in North America of Chef laccarino, Executive Chef & owner of the Michelin 2-Star Don Alfonso 1890 in Sorrento, Italy, is sponsored by the Italian Consulate General.

Architecture Notes

ROM: the Lee-Chin Crystal is composed of five interlocking, selfsupporting prismatic structures that co-exist but are not attached to the original ROM building, except for the bridges that link them.
