Romaine Brooks in London & Paris with Joe Lucchesi



or many Romaine Brooks is an unknown artist. Her self-portrait shows an isolated figure. Little wonder-born into a family of great wealth, she was raised in a NY slum by a laundress while her mother traveled throughout Europe. Finally allowed to join her mother in Europe when she was twelve years old, she was enrolled in a "prison-like" convent school. How is it, then, that "Brooks emerged as a hero of her own making and a woman of action engaged in an aesthetic combat in an elite social and cultural world"?

We'll have a chance to find out when *the* recognized expert on Romaine Brooks – according to the Chief Curator of the Smithsonian American Arts Museum (SAAM) – arrives in Kalamazoo for our first lecture of 2017. Art League's March speaker, Joe Lucchesi, Ph.D., was the consulting curator and author of exhibition text for the SAAM's recent exhibit, 'The Art of Romaine Brooks.'

An American expatriate, Romaine Brooks (1874–1970) "crafted an androgynous appearance that challenged conventional ideas of how women should look and behave." Her ideas extend to many of the portraits she painted in the 1920s. The paintings are striking, and her later drawings are equally interesting. Brooks's drawings flirt with the surreal and may remind one of those of artist, novelist, and filmmaker Jean Cocteau.

Prof. Lucchesi, Associate Professor of Art History at St. Mary's College of Maryland is Coordinator of the St. Mary's Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Program. He has been described as a speaker who is "smart, easy going, and really engaging for public audiences." Lucchesi's talk, 'Romaine Brooks in London & Paris: A Legacy of LGBTQ Portraiture' will introduce us to striking paintings and drawings, a fascinating artist currently being rediscovered, and an answer to the question, "Why are there so few great women artists?"



Building America's Garden of Art from Rodin to Ai Weiwei



n acclaimed speaker, Dr. Joseph Becherer will present Art League's evening program on Wednesday April 12. His topic, 'Building America's Garden of Art from Rodin to Ai Weiwei' will reveal the rationale for collecting particular art works and building new collections.

Rated at the top of many museum and garden must-see lists, Frederik Meijer Gardens & Sculpture Park attracts visitors from near and far. As its Chief Curator and VP of Collections and Exhibitions, Joseph Becherer, has led the development of its internationally-acclaimed permanent collection of Modern and Contemporary sculpture.

Dr. Becherer earned a BFA and MFA at Ohio University, and completed a Ph.D. at Indiana University. He has been with Meijer Gardens & Sculpture Park for 18 years. Among his many additional involvements, he is: the Lena Meijer Professor in the History of Art at Aquinas College, teaching courses in Renaissance, Baroque, Modern, and Contemporary art; has been a PBS Arts contributor; written many books and articles; and, serves as a regular columnist on visual arts for the Grand Rapids Magazine.

Recognized for his work in the arts and humanities by numerous advisory and professional organizations–locally, nationally, and internationally–Becherer has the added distinction of being honored by the Republic of Italy and by the Shiga Prefectural Government in Japan.
