October 11, 2023 Charles Burke – 5:30 Reception. Lecture begins at 7:00.

Charles Burke will speak about his journey as an arts administrator, arts educator and his vision for the Frederik Meijer Gardens and Sculpture Park. In February 2023, Charles Burke became the new President and CEO of



Meijer Gardens succeeding David Hooker, who announced his retirement in 2022. Burke brings years of experience in arts and culture to his new role, having served as president and CEO of The War Memorial Association in Grosse Pointe Farms for past nine years. Previously, Burke spent a significant portion of his career as both an executive and orchestral conductor for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO).

"I am honored to be selected as the next president and CEO of such a worldrenowned and beloved cultural institution," Burke said. "I am eager to work with

the talented team at Meijer Gardens." Burke is a graduate of Leadership Detroit XXXV and holds degrees from George Mason University and West Virginia University, executive leadership training at the Harvard Business School and Columbia College and as a Creative Alliances Fellow and Emerging Nonprofit Leaders Fellow for National Arts Strategies.

He is active in the nonprofit sector, volunteering in several roles including board director for Jefferson East, TechTown Detroit, community advisory board for Beaumont Health Grosse Pointe, editorial board of the Grosse Pointe News, executive producer for Live Inspired Productions and Michigan Youth Arts Festival.



November 8, 2023 10:00 am--Nayda Collazo-Llorens



Nayda Collazo-Llorens will speak about her life as an interdisciplinary artist from Puerto Rico. She earned an MFA degree from New York University and a BFA degree from Massachusetts College of Art and Design. Her work has been exhibited at El Museo del Barrio in New York City, The Mattress Factory in Pittsburgh, Museum of Latin American Art in Long Beach, The Patricia & Phillip Frost Art Museum in Miami, Bass Museum of Art in Miami Beach, Urban Institute for Contemporary Arts in Grand Rapids, Museo de

Arte Contemporáneo in San Juan, Museo Universitario del Chopo in Mexico City, and The Dowse Art Museum in New Zealand, among others. She has received grants from the Pollock-Krasner Foundation, Oolite Arts, and Beta-Local, among others, and is a former Visiting Fellow at the Arcus Center for Social Justice Leadership. Her work is featured in the book Relational Undercurrents: Contemporary Art of the Caribbean Archipelago, published by Duke University Press; A to Z of Caribbean Art, published by Robert & Christopher in Trinidad and Tobago; and The Dark Would: Language Art Anthology, published by Apple Pie in the UK. Her work has been reviewed in The New York Times, Art News, Art Net, Art Nexus, Hyperallergic, Arte al Día International, BOMB, and Newcity, among others. She currently lives and works in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

Laura De Becker, Interim Chief Curator and the Helmut and Candis Stern Curator of African Art at the University of Michigan Museum of Art (UMMA).

Many of the works De Becker oversees were donated from the late Helmut Stern's collection of Central African art, widely viewed as one of the finest private collections in the world. She will discuss the complex issues of repatriation, provenance, and collaboration which are among the pressing issues facing museums with collection of African objects.



April 10, 2024, 10 am -Tuliza Fleming



Tuliza Fleming will speak on Visual Art and The Americal Experience: A Journey into the Era or Reckoning. Dr. Fleming is the Curator of American Art at the National Museum of African American History and Culture (NMAAHC), Smithsonian Institution. She received her M.A. and Ph.D. in American art history from the University of Maryland, College Park (1997 and 2007), and her B.A. from Spelman College (1994). During her tenure at the NMAAHC, she worked to build the museum's foundational American art collection, supervised the creation of a collection-based multi-media interactive, co-curated the traveling exhibition, Ain't

Nothing Like the Real Thing: How the Apollo Theater Shaped American Entertainment, and served as the lead curator for the museum's inaugural exhibition, Visual Art and the American Experience. Formerly, Dr. Fleming served in the position of Associate Curator of the American Art at The Dayton Art Institute in Dayton, Ohio.

EXHIBITION HIGHLIGHTS

SEPTEMBER 16, 2023 - DECEMBER 31, 2023

A Bridge Between Two Worlds: Works by Wu Jian'an is the first major museum exhibition featuring the artist's incredibly meticulous work in the United States. The exhibition features a variety of objects demonstrating the artist's creative evolution over two decades. Frequently, the artist's complex and multi-layered compositions include thousands of elements that reference contemporary, mythological, and obscure folklore. Wu Jian'an work has been referred to as a hybrid of past and future, figure and abstraction, and tradition and innovation.



SEPTEMBER 16, 2023 - DECEMBER 31, 2023

C. C. Wang: Lines of Abstraction

C. C. Wang is best known as a preeminent twentieth-century connoisseur and collector of pre-modern Chinese art, a reputation that often overshadows his own artistic achievements. Held twenty years after the artist's death, C. C. Wang: Lines of Abstraction recenters Wang's extra-ordinary career on his own artistic practice to reveal an original quest for tradition and innovation in the global twentieth century. Spanning seven decades, the exhibition focuses on the artist's distinctive synthesis of Chinese ink painting and American postwar abstraction.



OCTOBER 14, 2023 - JANUARY 28, 2024-- Kirk Newman Faculty Review

This biennial exhibition reveals why the Kirk Newman Art School (KNAS) faculty members are among the leading artists in Southwest Michigan. Featuring new directions in the work of more than 40 professional artists-educators, this exciting display of media and techniques provides a glimpse into the artistic prowess of our faculty. Highlighting a distinctive range of talent, expect fine artwork in ceramics, sculpture, painting, jewelry, photography, fiber, and more. Although many of these award-winning artists exhibit across the region, this is an opportunity to experience their works together, as a team dedicated to sharing the visual arts with everyone inside and beyond the KNAS studios.

To kick-off the KIA's 100th Year Celebration, the KNAS Faculty Review will also highlight works from some of the most prominent former faculty members.
